Parents MUST pick up their students at dismissal time as there is no supervision on the playground or in front of the school after dismissal.

Parents are requested to wait for their child(ren) at the lunch benches or at the gate – NOT IN THE HALLS OR BY THE CLASSROOMS!

IMPORTANT SCHOOL-WIDE RULES

<u>Playground Supervision</u>: Adult supervision is provided between 8:35-3:12. Students should NOT be on campus earlier than 8:20 a.m. Upon arrival at school, grades 1-5 should report to the lunch benches until the playground opens at 8:35. ALL students must be picked up promptly at dismissal time. Children may not play on the playground after school.

<u>Loitering</u>: Loitering in or nearby a public school is prohibited by law (State Penal code 6530). EVERYONE, including small children, older brothers/sisters and friends, must wait quietly and orderly at the lunch benches for school to be dismissed.

<u>Parking</u>: Parking is <u>VERY</u> limited around the school. We ask that parents park on the opposite side of the street of the school and use the crossing guard. <u>Please obey all parking signs and traffic laws</u>. All spaces around the school and in the lot are assigned for **STAFF ONLY**. The large playground will be open for parking at all evening events.

Satety

- 1. Students will learn that walking in halls is a safer habit than running.
- 2. Crossing streets at the crosswalks will help avoid accidents.
- 3. Parents... if you pick up your children after school, PLEASE do not double park on the street. If you park on the opposite side of 178th street, instruct your child to cross the street <u>at the corner</u> with the crossing guard. DO NOT CALL THEM TO CROSS IN TRAFFIC!
- $\ensuremath{\mathsf{4}}.$ Students must be picked up by parents promptly at dismissal time.
- 5. Parents should not be in halls or on playground without an office pass.
- 6. NO double-parking by the Kindergarten gate.
